Meet Martha "Grammy" Bradford and her two daughters, Celia and Osca, and daughter-in-law, Lydia. Talk to members of the family as they go about their daily routine and prepare the "nooning" meal on the woodstove. Ask them about a woman's role on the farm in the 1800s. <p><b>NOON</b></p>	<p><b>A LETTER FOR FATHER: GENERAL CADWALLADER COLDEN WASHBURN</b>  <i>Meet Patty Washburn and her two granddaughters, Nettie and Fannie</i>  <i>Performed by Claudia Bell, Renee Bonin, and Kathy Cutter</i></p> <p>It's the mid-1800s at Norlands and Nettie and Fanny are living with their grandparents, Israel and Patty. Their mother is hospitalized and their father, Cadwallader Colden Washburn, is a congressman and businessman living in Wisconsin. He has sent his young daughters to live with their grandparents, on the same farm where he grew up. In this special vignette, see "Patty" help her granddaughters write a letter to their father sharing their adventures and perspectives about life on a farm.
